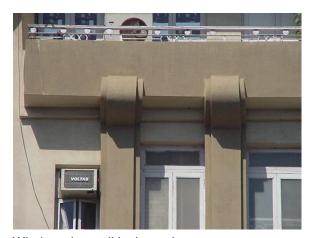

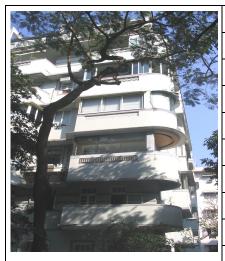

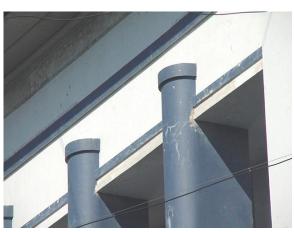

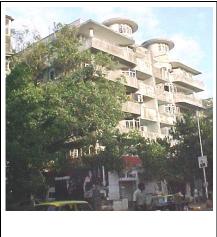

The ground floor was leased to the Bombay branch of the National City Bank of New York who continues to occupy it to this day. The architects, Master, Sathe and Bhuta, took full benefit of the vantage site and positioned the main entrance at the corner of the building, with an imposing 100 feet high dome. The building not only changed the aspect of this corner but also served as an attractive point of entry to the central avenue leading to Ballard Estate. The impressive building stimulated demand for plots and set a precedent for the type of buildings that were subsequently constructed on the new avenue.

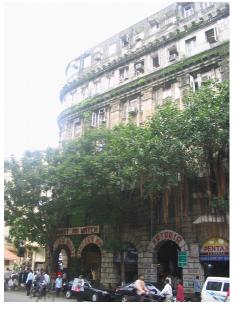

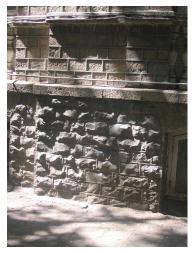
